Cost All courses are \$220 for 30 hours of instruction. There is a \$30.00 application fee and a \$20.00 program fee. All courses must be paid in full before the beginning of the class. Payment may be made by credit card, check drawn on a US bank, or money order. Classes not paid in full on or before the first day of class will be assessed a 10% tuition late payment fee.

Eligibility Students must be at least 18 years of age or high school graduates literate in their first language. Please contact us for specific information about admissibility.

Placement Test The placement test is given before classes start. Check the webpage for specific dates. Students must register and pay for the course before taking the placement test. Registration includes showing proof of MMR.

MMR Immunizations (MMR = measles, mumps and rubella) All students born since 1956 must provide proof of TWO measles vaccinations and ONE rubella vaccination. You may bring the yellow immunization brochure signed and stamped by your doctor or your immunization documentation. If you do not have documentation, you may be immunized at the Pima County Health Clinics or the University of Arizona Health Center where the MMR is available.

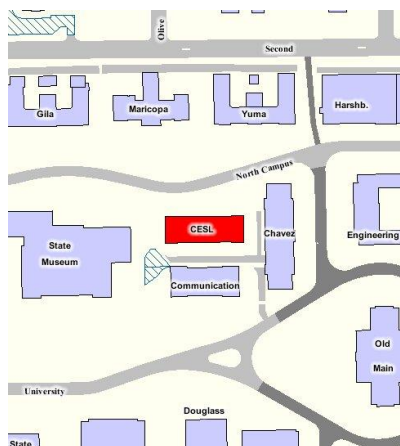
