

Schedule for Evening English Classes



Center for English as a Second Language Fall II 2009 October 19th to December 10th

Students must be a high school graduate or at least 18 years of age and literate in their first language.
All classes meet for a total of 30 hours.

Classes offered on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6-8pm

Presentation & Discussion Skills: This course helps students develop essential strategies for public speaking in professional and academic settings. Intermediate and advanced students will become more confident through practice participating in small group discussions and by giving oral presentations based on analysis of readings/recordings. Active listening skills, pronunciation practice, critical thinking and acquiring new vocabulary will be emphasized. Prerequisite: Completion of minimum Level 50, High Intermediate 1 General English or have the approval of the Program Coordinator.

Pronunciation: This course is for students who want to focus on pronunciation of American English through intensive practice. Coursework will involve developing self-monitoring skills and a considerable amount of oral practice in order to get the feel for the rhythm and flow of American English increase spoken English language proficiency. Students will have access to pronunciation software for practice in our language lab. Prerequisite: Completion of Level 50 or High Intermediate 1 General English or have the approval of the Program Coordinator.

Reading & Writing for Academic Purposes: This course will focus on helping students practice to develop essential writing skills needed by academics and professionals. Students will write more formal texts, such as academic essays, to more informal communications, such as letters and email. Students will read professional, published articles and essays written by successful E.S.L. students as touchstones for writing practice. Grammar issues will be addressed as needed. Prerequisite: Completion of Level 50 or High Intermediate 1 General English or have the approval of the Program Coordinator.

Classes offered on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6-8pm

General English: These are integrated classes--speaking, listening, reading, and writing--with opportunities to practice pronunciation, vocabulary building, grammar, learning strategies and computer technology skills. Students will develop English language proficiency by exploring various topics in global culture through meaningful communication at 4 levels: low intermediate 1 & 2, intermediate 1 & 2. Students will be encouraged to participate in clubs and activities to develop language learning.

IELTS & TOEFL Test Techniques: This is a hybrid course with significant web-support. Students meet with the instructor face-to-face (F2F) once a week, and are required to complete multiple assignments online to prepare for the next meeting. Having web-access is crucial for students' success. The course will focus on further development of students' writing, reading, speaking, and listening skills, especially those that should ensure the students' success in taking the TOEFL/IELTS tests. Students will reinforce and expand their existing language skills, knowledge of TOEFL/IELTS-related vocabulary, grammar structures, written rhetorical formats, and test-taking strategies. Prerequisite: Completion of Level 50 or High Intermediate 1 General English or approval of the Program Coordinator.

Step 1 Application: Complete an application from our website or our office, CESL room 101. Submit the application in person or fax or it to our office. Please include payment of **tuition and fees** and **proof of MMR immunization**. **Apply before October 22nd to avoid a 10% late fee on tuition.*

Step 2 Registration: Stop by CESL room 101 in person, between 8:30-4:30 p.m. to complete a registration form.

Step 3 Placement: Take the placement test Wednesday, October 14th at 5 p.m. or Thursday, October 15th at 5 p.m. or, if you are a returning student, email Dolores Del Giorgio at doloresd@email.arizona.edu for class placement information.
